

Student Temporary Employment Opportunity New Hampshire Summer 2009

Student Internship:

- Engineering Aid Summer Intern – Receive training and professional experience in gathering and assembling survey data for use in developing designs for the installation of natural resource conservation practices needed to control soil erosion, improve wildlife habitat, restore wetland areas, and agricultural best management practices. Primarily works outside throughout the summer, on a survey crew serving as a rod-person or survey party chief. Work may also involve performing construction layout and inspecting the installation of conservation practices.

Salary and Benefits:

- Approximately \$10.31 to \$12.78 per hour.
- Position location(s):
 - 2 individuals stationed in Woodsville New Hampshire, but working throughout northern and western New Hampshire.
 - 2 individuals in stationed Epping New Hampshire, but working throughout southern New Hampshire.
- Housing stipend may be available.

Additional Comments:

- A total of 4 students will be hired, working in survey teams of 2 people per team.
- Looking for students who are currently in a technical program with course work in fields of study, such as agricultural, civil or environmental engineering/technology. Other fields of study in natural resources will be considered.
- Surveying experience is preferable, but not a requirement.
- Students will be required to stand for long periods, walk over rough terrain, carry survey equipment, cut brush, and endure environmental conditions.
